

# Public Notice of Intent to Apply for Federal Grant Funds

For the 2022-2023 school year, Ki Charter Academy will apply for funding under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965 as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015

Based on previous years' programs and based on current year needs assessment data, Ki Charter Academy plans to use these funds to support the intent and purpose of said grant.

Intent to apply for 2022-2023 funding under the ESSA Consolidated Grant will include:

Title I, Part A	To provide all children significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gap	\$78,795	Under the Schoolwide provisions of ESSA (Public Law 114-95 Sec. 1114), these funds are used by the district to support instructional salaries and supplies to upgrade the entire educational program to raise the achievement of the lowest-achieving students. Ki Charter Academy also complies with the Parent and Family Engagement provisions of ESSA and the required homeless reservation.
Title I, Part D	To prevent at-risk youth from dropping out of school, and to provide dropouts, and children and youth returning from correctional facilities or institutions for neglected or delinquent children and youth, with a support system to ensure their continued education and the involvement of their families and communities.	\$505,449	Funds provide programs that assist children and youth returning to local schools from correctional facilities, dropout prevention programs serving at-risk children and youth, special programs to meet unique academic needs (including career/technical education, special education, career counseling, curriculum-based youth entrepreneurship education), and financial aid assistance for postsecondary education, and support for other success initiatives.
Title II, Part A	To support educators in their work to improve the overall quality of instruction and ensure equity of educational opportunity for all students.	\$12,448	Funds are used to recruit, support, and retain effective teachers and principals and to provide professional development/educator growth.
Title IV, Part A	To increase the capacity of state education agencies, local educational agencies (LEAs), campuses, and communities to provide all students access to a well-rounded education; to improve academic outcomes by maintaining safe and healthy students; and to improve the use of technology to advance student academic achievement.	\$10,000	Using the flexibility under Title V, Part A - Funding Transferability, these funds will be transferred for use in meeting the intent and purpose of Title I, Part A at eligible Title I, Part A elementary campuses.
